

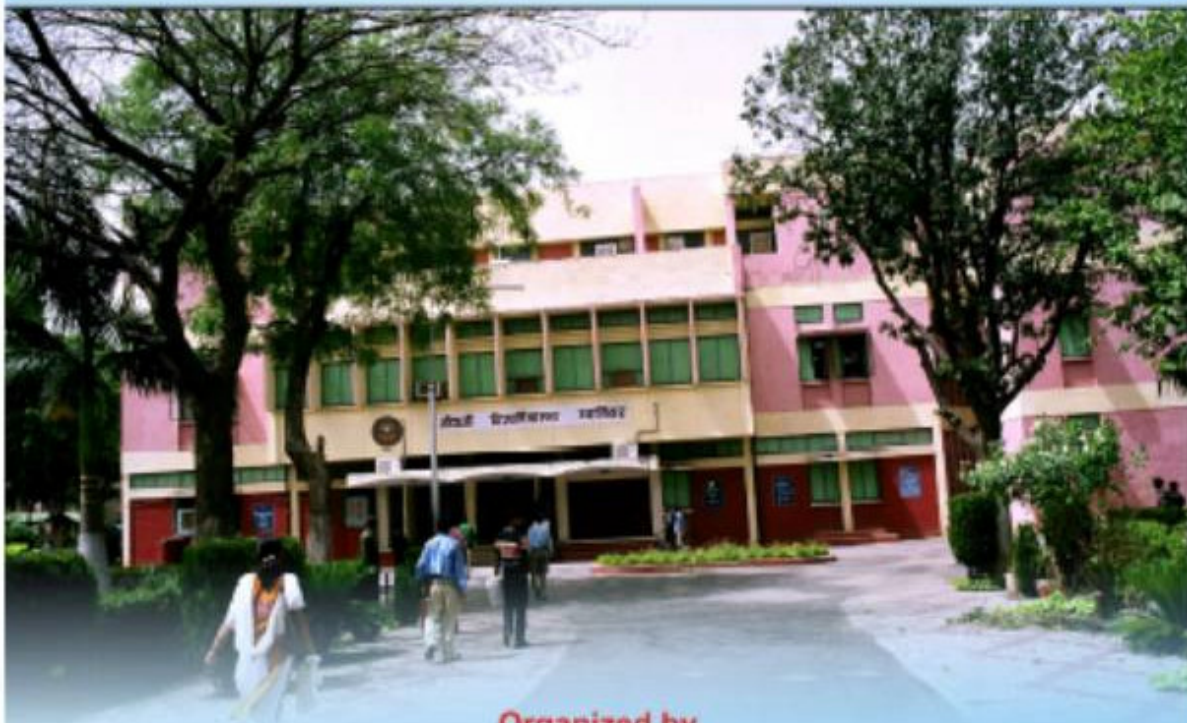

Toxicology is one of the most interdisciplinary disciplines where biologists, microbiologists, chemists, engineers, environmentalists, ecologists and other scientists have worked hand in hand. With the new tools of molecular biology, genomics and proteomics emerging rapidly, this international conference will address challenging issues related to toxicology, toxicity assessment, toxicogenomics and preventive measures.
